WASHINGTON, DC – The Hispanic Heritage Foundation (HHF) and its sponsors will honor 21 Latino high school seniors from the DC region for their accomplishments in the classroom, community and their focus on various categories during the 16th Annual DC Regional Hispanic Heritage Youth Awards on December 9 at the Rayburn House Office Building.
