

HISPANIC HERITAGE FOUNDATION AND SPONSORS HONOR SINGER BECKY G, ACTIVIST JULISSA ARCE, AN LA TEACHER, AND EIGHT HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS FROM ACROSS USA AT 17th NATIONAL YOUTH AWARDS IN LOS ANGELES

LOS ANGELES, CA – The Hispanic Heritage Foundation (HHF), sponsors, community and business leaders, and celebrities will honor singer Becky G. and activist Julissa Arce for serving as role models in the public eye, an LA teacher, and eight high school seniors from across the United States for their leadership in the classroom and community at the 17th Annual National Youth Awards. The ceremony will take place on Thursday, February 4th (10 a.m. media availability/reception | 11:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. ceremony) at William Morris Endeavour, 9601 Wilshire Blvd, Beverly Hills, CA. The National Youth Awards will be broadcast by Vme TV as a special. In addition to Becky G, other celebrities include Grammy Award-Winning Group La Santa Cecilia, Latin Grammy Producer of the Year Sebastian Krys, Actress Aimee Garcia, Actor Raul Castillo, Actor Nicholas Gonzalez, Film Director Carmen Marron, Comedian Ernie G, Designer Mario de la Torre, and Journalist/TV Personality Jackie Cacho plus other surprise guests. Vme TV will broadcast the program as a special and HHF will promote the young role models, teacher and parents through national multi-media campaign (visit www.HispanicHeritage.org and follow the Youth Awards at @HHFoundation #YouthAwards #YA15)

The eight winning students were selected from 10,000 applicants and hundreds of regional recipients in various categories – each of the awardees represent each category (see below) and boast nearly a 4.0 GPA with hundreds of hours of community service and serve as role models to inspire others. In addition to educational grants, the young leaders will get Chromebooks, flown to LA with a parent, and receive personalized styling from Macy's.

"We are proud to honor yet another class of outstanding young Latino leaders who will certainly make an impact on our communities and workforce as they move forward in their careers," said Antonio Tijerino, President and CEO of HHF. "We thank our sponsors for their support as we focus in what we consider priority fields for America. We truly believe our Youth Awardees are leaders of today, not tomorrow. Frankly, we can't afford to wait."

"We are also thrilled to recognize the amazing Becky G who has demonstrated that vision, hard work and ganas in addition to talent can make any dream a reality," added Tijerino. "It's also a privilege to recognize Julissa Arce for serving as an example of the value proposition immigrants present to America. They, along with our Youth Awardees are truly role models for all young people."

The self-made 18-year-old Becky G describes her sound as "urban pop with a bit of Latin spice" and has amassed over 12 million followers on social media since posting YouTube videos as a tween with a big voice and personality. Growing up in Inglewood, CA, Becky G and her family moved into her grandparents' garage because of financial difficulty which prompted Becky to have a "midlife crisis" at nine and decided to be an entertainer. After being discovered by famed producer Dr. Luke, Becky G signed a deal with record label Kemosabe/RCA, which has led to collaborations from Will.i.am to Pitbull. She has toured with Demi Lovato, Katy Perry and Jason Derulo. If that wasn't enough, she is set to play Yellow Ranger in the new Power Rangers movie and is the latest face of Covergirl cosmetics. But Becky knows who she is and that's why HHF is presenting her with the Inspira Award as a role model to youth. When asked why she hasn't fixed the gap in her teeth, she responded "why should I change myself to be what everybody else wants me to be when I'm OK with who I am and I'm happy with who I am?"

Julissa Arce is a writer, speaker, immigrant rights advocate and author of the forthcoming book, “My (Underground) American Dream, which has been optioned for a TV program. She made national and international headlines when she revealed that she had achieved the American Dream of wealth and status while undocumented. She is the co-founder and chairman of the Ascend Educational Fund, a scholarship fund for immigrant students regardless of their immigration status. She is also on the board of directors of the National Immigration Law Center and the national board of directors of CollegeSpring. Prior to becoming an advocate she built a successful career on Wall Street as a vice president at Goldman Sachs and a director at Merrill Lynch. Julissa now uses her inspirational story to change the conversation around immigration which is why she is being honored by HHF’s Inspira Award.
