WEC's unique model relies on a dedicated corps of volunteer teachers, tutors, and job coaches who provided over \$1 million worth of teaching hours last year. "The key to our success is our volunteers," said Joan Kerrigan, Vice Chair the Board of Directors and a volunteer teacher. "Without their tireless efforts, we would not have been able to serve our students for 26 years. It has been an honor and a privilege to work with so many extraordinary volunteers who inspire our students every day."

WEC will be celebrating its volunteers on May 13 at a cocktail reception at the Arena Stage's Mead Center from 6:30-8:30 pm. Among the celebrations, there will be testimonials from current students and recognition of all volunteers, past and current.
